

Tania de Leon is a Mexican visual artist and an academic professor dedicated to experimental animation, drawing, and engraving. In 2013 she was honored with one of the most important academic awards in this country, the National Acknowledgment for Young Academic (Reconocimiento Universidad Nacional para Jóvenes Académicos).

She obtained a PhD in Fine Arts specialized in Expressive, Formal and Spatial-Temporal Components of Animation, at the Universidad Politécnica de Valencia (UPV), Spain. Before that, she acquired a Master Degree in Multimedia Production for the Internet at the same university. She also has Master Degree in History of Art and a Bachelor's Degree in Visual Arts both from the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM).

Her artistic work has been focused on fields like experimental animation, drawing, engraving, multimedia and public art. It has been exhibited in different cultural spaces, in countries as Mexico, Spain, Taiwan, among others. She has worked as professor in institutions such as the Jaime Primero University at Castellón, Spain; Tecnológico de Monterrey CCM (ITESM); and nowadays she's Tenure Professor at the Facultad de Artes y Diseño (UNAM), at Mexico City.

From September 2015 to July 2016 she got a grant from the UNAM (PASPA Program) for her Sabbatical at Lisbon (FBAUL) and Valencia (UPV).
